The main grievance of the petitioner is that the private respondent alongwith other persons, is causing obstruction to repair the commissioned project i.e. Balsio

Hydro Electric Power (HEP) Project carried on by the petitioner in District Chamba, H.P. It is also submitted that due permissions have been obtained by the petitioner from the respondents-State for the construction of its road leading to the project.

2. Issue notice only to respondents No. 1 to 4. Mr. J.K. Verma, Advocate, waives the same on behalf of the aforesaid respondents.

3. Keeping in view the relief sought, read with the judgment dated 27th November, 2014, passed by this Court in CWP No. 8782 of 2014, titled as M/s Raheja Hydel Power Pvt. Ltd. versus State of H.P. & others, we deem it proper to dispose of this writ petition, at this stage, by directing respondents No. 1 to 4 to take all steps to maintain law and order and also to ensure that no unlawful obstruction is caused on the road leading to the project of the petitioner. They are also directed to take all steps to provide adequate security cover to the writ petitioner at the project site including road, in case the writ petitioner approaches the concerned Authorities, at the expense of the petitioner.

4. The writ petition is disposed of accordingly
alongwith all pending applications.
